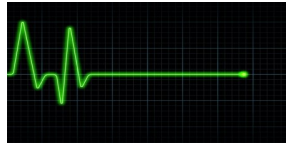

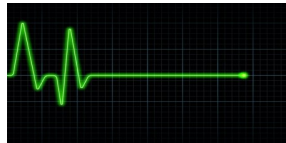

As a result of the pro-abortion ruling in *Planned Parenthood v. Sundquist*, Tennesseans can no longer enact reasonable protections for abortion-vulnerable women or unborn children. Justice William Barker wrote the only dissenting opinion in that case, stating, “**The effect of the Court’s holding today is to remove from the people all power, except by constitutional amendment, to enact reasonable regulations of abortion.**”

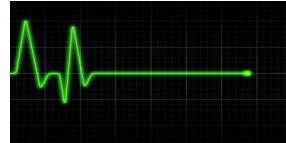

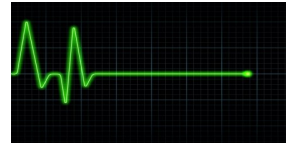
