

Help Stop the Rewriting of American History

Suggested Action Items

1. Contact your State Board of Education (SBOE) and urge them to pass a resolution demanding the College Board delay the implementation of the Advanced Placement U.S. History (APUSH) Curriculum Framework and rewrite the Framework to align with state history standards.

If the SBOE is unresponsive, contact one of the following to pass a resolution:

- Superintendent and/or local board of education members of large school districts.
- State legislator.
- Republican and Democrat Party Chairs (state and local).

2. Ask your state Department of Education (DOE) how much state tax money has been budgeted for Advanced Placement courses. Ask them what amount has been budgeted for the following:
 - Teacher attendance at APUSH workshops/conferences to learn the new APUSH Framework.
 - New APUSH textbooks.
 - APUSH exams.

If the DOE is unresponsive to your request, identify a state legislator who can ask for this information through his/her legislative research department.

3. Request face-to-face meetings with your state legislators to
 - Educate them on the anti-American, leftist agenda of APUSH.
 - Inform them as to how much taxpayers are paying the unelected, unaccountable College Board to usurp your state's standards, in contravention of American values.
 - Ask your legislators to initiate legislation to defund APUSH. If your legislature is not in session, even pre-filing a bill can be used as a media event which will raise awareness among other legislators and voters as well.
4. Network with and educate other parents. It may be too late for students to withdraw from APUSH classes they've already registered for, but parents should make it known their children will not take APUSH in the future unless the course is revised to align with state standards.
5. Educate your local school board members on the new APUSH Framework (this includes attending and speaking at local board meetings).
6. Write letters-to-the-editor and/or op-ed pieces for your local newspaper.
