Rep. Bill Kidd (R-Independence) sponsored HB113 -"Simon's Law" - which

would prevent hospitals/doctors from putting a DNR in a minor patient's file without the permission of one of the parents or guardians. The bill was heard in the House Health and Mental Health Policy Committee on February 25, but that was the last action it .

CWA of Missouri is bringing attention to the many abuses of parental rights here in Missouri, and this is one of them. Please come learn about the Crosiers' experience and how we can make sure a bill like HB113 passes the Missouri General Assembly next session.
