Greetings and Merry Christmas to all,

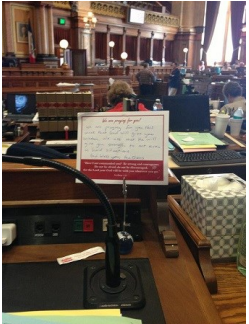

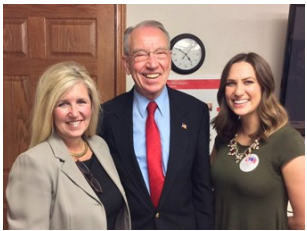
CWA of Iowa Goose Lake Prayer/Action Chapter

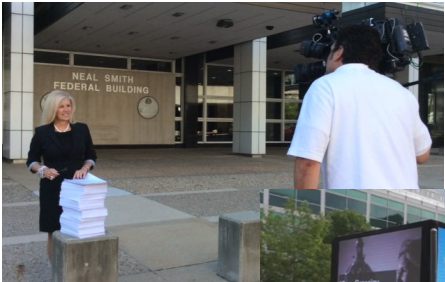

Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) had support for his role in protecting the constitutional process of Senate confirmations for Supreme Court nominees by delivering thousands of petitions to his office and renting a billboard-style truck with images of CWA members supporting Grassley's stance on the Court in order to counter the harassing messages on trucks sponsored by out-of-state groups.

In May, CWA of Iowa was the first call when concerned parents heard Fairfield School District was voluntarily implementing transgender bathrooms. We literally broke the story on Truth For Our Time radio heard on 99.3 FM in central Iowa having the school superintendent, a parent and a student join in the discussion. Having an existing prayer chapter in the community, CWA ladies were instrumental on the front lines meeting with parents and pastors who continue the battle to protect their children.



In June, I was honored to join CWA's CEO Penny Nance and 1,000 other evangelical leaders in New York City to share concerns with then-candidate Donald Trump.

As part of the nation's largest women's public policy organization, CWA of Iowa was one of the first to educate Iowans about Islam's impact and Sharia Law's oppression of women. This year we spoke at meetings in every congressional district and we're already responding to invitations for 2017.

This fall, CWA of Iowa leaders joined CWA National's and Family Research Council's Values Action Bus Tour across Iowa from Davenport to Sioux City.
