

Project 535

"Project 535" is a volunteer lobbying program unique to Concerned Women for America (CWA) in which the faces and voices of our half-million members come alive to bring our nation back to Biblical values. This program has several components that reach across the nation from Capitol Hill to the districts and homes of CWA volunteers. Officials cannot help but notice grassroots America when our "Project 535" teams move for change.



The name for this program is derived from the number of members of Congress: 100 U.S. Senators and 435 Members of the House of Representatives.

Influencing these 535 members of our Congress is the key to influencing federal legislation.

CWA members in Iowa have an opportunity to participate as either Capitol Hill Liaisons or Home District Liaisons. Training is provided for those who complete the application process. Capitol Hill Liaisons usually lobby once a month in Washington, while Home District Liaisons visit, call or e-mail on an as-needed basis.

Capitol Hill Liaisons

Once a month, trained volunteer lobbyist representing CWA members across the nation receive information on a single issue (usually by e-mail), meet with CWA staff in Washington, D.C., for a briefing on the same subject, then meet with federal legislators on Capitol Hill. The teams can tackle between 40 and 70 congressional offices in a day! Congressional staffers note the astute knowledge of our Capitol Hill Liaisons and the influence they have on legislative decisions. The results of the meetings and suggested action items are reported back to CWA liaisons in the legislator's state.



Iowa Home District Liaisons

On the state level, we look for one "Home District Liaison" volunteer in each of Iowa's five Congressional Districts and for our two U.S. Senators. These liaisons meet with or contact their representative or senators at their district offices.

Home District Liaisons receive the same briefing information as the Capitol Hill Liaisons. They follow their representative's

voting record, as well as use the CWA Web site, www.cwfa.org, for legislative updates.

CWA of Iowa depends on Home District Liaisons for information regarding when and which congressmen will benefit from hearing from their CWA members on a particular issue.
