Please Call for Vetoes Now!

Ask the governor to reject these bad bills

Action: Please contact Gov. Schwarzenegger without delay and ask him to veto the bills noted below. You may call his Sacramento office and use the phone menu anytime day or night (see quick dialing details below). You may call any of his California offices (numbers below) and speak with a staff member to indicate your opposition, or you may fax your letter to the numbers shown. Please continue making contacts over the next days. The deadline for the governor to sign or veto bills (or let them become law without his signature) is October 14, but he may take action any day. **PLEASE KNOW YOUR CONTACTS MATTER.**

Quick Dialing Details (these items are subject to change, so listen carefully)

Sacramento phone menu for Assembly bills:

Dial (916) 445-2841, press "1" for English, press "2" for Assembly bills, then:

"2" for AB 43 ("2" again to oppose)

"3" for AB 14 ("2" to oppose)

"4" for AB 102 ("2" to oppose)

"5" for AB 394 ("2" to oppose)

Sacramento phone menu for Senate bills:

Dial (916) 445-2841, press "1" for English, press "5" for Senate bills, then:

"2" for SB 777 ("2" again to oppose)

Sexual Orientation in Business and Education Code – AB 14 adds "sexual orientation" to the list of nondiscrimination criteria in many areas of business and association codes, including athletic clubs and ALL colleges and universities. Restricts right of conscience and religious speech.

Same-Sex "Marriage" – AB 43 creates "marriage" between any two persons, rather than between a man and a woman as voters required under Proposition 22. *Under the state constitution the California legislature cannot arbitrarily thwart the will of the people, as this bill would do, but many are willing to try.*

Domestic Partnerships – AB 102 allows domestic partners to easily change their surnames mimicking and undermining marriage.

Sexual Orientation in Education – AB 394 requires schools districts to establish antidiscrimination and antiharassment policies based on “actual or perceived” gender or sexual orientation and requires monitoring of compliance.

Sex Education Programs – AB 629 adds to requirements for any directly or indirectly state-funded sex education programs. Requires that all programs include information on at least one contraceptive or STD risk-reducing device.

Illegal Immigration – AB 976 prohibits local governments from implementing ordinances requiring a check on immigration status or citizenship for housing and also *prohibits private property owners from making such inquiries.*

Financial Aid for Illegal Aliens – SB 1, the “California Dream Act,” requires Cal State and California community colleges (as well as the University of CA system if Regents approve) to offer tuition assistance, fee waivers and financial aid to illegal aliens who attended a California high school for three or more years and graduated or attained its equivalence.

Homosexuality in the Schools – SB 777 bans any school activities, programs, or instructional materials that might be considered “biased” against homosexuality or bisexuality, *K-12*. SB 777 could stifle any speech supporting traditional values on our campuses. The bill could also have serious consequences for Christian colleges and universities, which would be required to add “sexual orientation” to their antidiscrimination policies unless they are specifically part of a “religious organization.”
