WHAT is a Poll Watcher?

A citizen volunteer appointed to observe the election process and report any problems to the County Auditor.

WHO Can Be a Poll Watcher?

Any person appointed by a stakeholder on the ballot such as a County Chairman or candidates who have been nominated by petition to appear on the ballot. (Write-in candidates cannot appoint poll watchers.) See list of County Chairmen on reverse side.

WHERE Can You Serve?

At any Iowa polling place or absentee ballot counting location where appointed.

WHEN Do Poll Watchers Serve?

On Election Day, November 6, 7:00 a.m.- 9:00 p.m. at the polls, and/or Monday, November 5, at absentee precincts during counting of ballots. (Watchers may arrange to work shorter hours or split shifts.)
