




Marriage Deserves a Defense


On March 26 and 27 the United States Supreme Court will hear oral arguments on two crucial cases dealing with marriage.


Ten Things You Need to Know about Marriage at the Supreme Court:


 **The two cases: *Hollingsworth v. Perry* and *US v. Windsor*.** *Perry* will deal with California's Proposition 8, the voter-approved constitutional amendment that defined marriage as the union between one man and one woman. *Windsor* will deal with the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which defines marriage in the same way for federal purposes alone.

 **We do not need another *Roe*.** The country is in the middle of an emotional and very significant debate about marriage and family and children. And rightfully so. The Supreme Court should allow that debate to continue, instead of snatching it from us, like they did with the infamous *Roe v. Wade* abortion decision. Another *Roe* will divide the country even more and further tarnish the reputation of the Court.

 **The question is whether “we the people” have the right to define marriage as it has always been, between one man and one woman, for the sake of our children.** The social science data confirms what we know from our experience and what the Word of God tells us: children do best when they have both a mom and a dad who love each other and their children unconditionally. There is nothing radical or hateful about that.

 **It is NOT about “rights.” It is about moral approval of homosexual behavior.** The myth that “gay” activists want the same rights as everyone else has been completely dispelled. Various states (California included), offer all the rights of marriage, under another name, like civil unions, and “gay rights” activists have emphatically rejected it.


 **It is NOT a civil rights issue.** “Gay” rights advocates compare their lifestyle to African-American discrimination, yet the logic is lacking. Race is unchangeable. Some homosexuals believe they were born that way, but others do not. Research for a “gay gene” has been a massive failure. The growing number of testimonies by ex-homosexuals stating it was a choice is simply too significant to ignore.


 **It is NOT even about marriage.** It is about who gets to decide the most important questions of our age. Should nine Justices in black robes decide the fate of the entire country, while invalidating the will and votes of millions of Americans?


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**The re-definition of marriage will have a major impact on your family.**

If marriage is re-defined, then the family is re-defined and children must be taught accordingly in school. It is simply the logical extension of such action.

**We should not buy the media's inevitability narrative.** Most surveys show that a significant majority of Americans (about 62 percent) still want marriage preserved as the union between one man and one woman. We can preserve marriage if we are willing to stand boldly for God's Truth.**Religious Liberties are at stake.** Persecution is already happening in the states that have gone the way of same-sex "marriage." Christians who offer wedding services, for example, are being forced to provide services for homosexual weddings or face steep fines. Christian beliefs on homosexuality simply must make way for "gay" rights for they will not allow any room for dissention in the public square.**We must choose this day whom you will serve.** The marriage issue is ultimately about the credibility of God's Word and the Gospel. We simply cannot choose to ignore the parts of the Word of God that do not conform to the times. God is. May we stand boldly for His principles, no matter the cost.
