It is our mission to rescue and restore the victims of sex trafficking in the state of Texas by ending the demand for commercial sex. Victims are the results of supply and demand. If you can eliminate the demand, traffickers have no need to create a supply.

Our Project

Our project is a multi-pronged statewide project to end the demand for commercial sex. We work in connection with Houston Rescue and Restore Coalition to educate key target groups who can play an integral part in demand reduction and elimination of sex trafficking in Texas.

Churches

It is our goal to distribute 4000 pieces of literature through 100 Texas churches. We want to seek a meeting with the leadership of these churches to help educate the congregants and their acquaintances about the issues surrounding sex trafficking in the state of Texas. This is designed for a two hour seminar but can be modified as you see fit for your setting. We would be happy to come and give a presentation specifically designed for you and your congregation or you are free to use these materials and present them to your congregation. Truck Stops

It is our goal to distribute 1400 brochures and other materials to regional truck terminals. (Targeted areas: El Paso, Midland, Lubbock, Amarillo, San Antonio, Brownsville, McAllen, Laredo, Houston, Beaumont/Orange, Dallas/Fort Worth, Longview, and Texarkana). The I-10 Corridor has been identified as a "primary" trafficking route. Children are trafficked at the truck stops as well as across the country through this medium of travel. College Campuses

It is our goal to distribute 3400 pieces of literature to six Texas college campuses (Texas Tech University; University of North Texas, University of Houston, University of Texas; University of Texas at El Paso, Texas A&M University at Kingsville). Our goal is to educate students about the issues surrounding sex trafficking in the state of Texas and to empower them to make a difference in our world. Men's Organizations

It is our goal to distribute 3000 pieces of literature through men's organizations such as: Promise Keepers and Gathering of Men to educate men around the state about the issues surrounding sex trafficking and how men's groups can make a difference. Hotels

It is our goal to engage more than 720 volunteers to write letters to five hotel chains such as Starwood, Hilton, Hyatt, Marriott, and Ritz-Carlton, urging them to adopt the ECPAT Code of Conduct. Travel

It is our goal to provide 400 pieces of literature for distribution in bus, train, and airports to educate travelers on Federal and State laws regarding sex-trafficking and sexual exploitation of children. In addition we are seeking to provide public service anti-human trafficking information to be printed in airline company magazines as well as training opportunities for members of the travel agency profession.

First Offender Program

It is our goal to implement a state wide “first offender” program with a “John School” in every major city in Texas. A “John School” is a type of educational intervention aimed at johns, or male clients of prostitutes; john schools are usually a diversion program, but can also be a condition of a criminal sentence. In most jurisdictions in which john schools exist, a man arrested for soliciting the services of a prostitute, or another related offense, may be offered john school as an alternative to criminal prosecution.

PSAs

It is our goal to provide Public Service Announcements for local radio stations and interviews to Radio and TV broadcasters in five regions of Texas each year warning men of the consequences of participation in the crime of sex-trafficking.
