Bush Commutes Border Agents' Sentences

On his last full day in office, President Bush has commuted the sentences of former U.S. Border Patrol agents Ignacio Ramos and Jose Compean. As Fox News reports, "The pair's case ignited debate across the country, as a chorus of organizations and members of Congress -- many of them Republican -- argued that the men were just doing their jobs. Rep. Dana Rohrabacher, R-Calif., was particularly outspoken on the issue, at one time describing Ramos and Compean as 'unjustly convicted men who never should have been prosecuted in the first place.'"
