



KINSEY, SEX AND LIES

Dr. Alfred C. Kinsey, a zoologist, revolutionized America's attitudes about sex through his books *Sexual Behavior in the Human Male* (1948)¹ and *Sexual Behavior in the Human Female* (1953).² His work is the animating principle behind most sex education in America. However, analysis of his research by Judith A. Reisman, Ph.D., has yielded some alarming discoveries, including how Dr. Kinsey acquired sexual data about children. It's time to take an inventory of Kinsey's work and consider what it has brought to our society.

COMING TO CONCLUSIONS

Kinsey propagated the idea that all children are "sexual beings" from birth. The most frightening aspect of his philosophy is how he arrived at this view; **Kinsey was a silent partner in the molestation of hundreds of children. The graph table below documents some of the abuse that Kinsey recorded.**

In chapter five of his *Male* book, Tables 30-34 describe pre-adolescent children's orgasms, beginning at the age of two months.

And how did the pedophile know when the child or infant reached orgasm? The children reacted by "violent convulsions of the whole body; heavy breathing, groaning, sobbing, or more violent cries, sometimes with an abundance of tears (especially among the younger children)" (p. 161, *Male* volume).

Paul Gebhard, Kinsey's co-author, frankly admitted that Kinsey researchers interviewed pedophiles, and declined to report them to police. "'An example of criminality is our refusal to cooperate with authorities in apprehending a pedophile we had interviewed who was being sought for a sex murder,' Gebhard told an interviewer."³

THE NAZI CONNECTION

This statement referred to Kinsey's correspondence with Dr. Friedrich Karl Hugo Viktor von Balluseck, a Nazi who was in charge of a small Polish town during World War II. Von Balluseck, according to testimony during his 1957 trial for a child sex murder, molested boys and girls from 1927 to 1957.⁴

As reported by the *Franfurter Allgemeine Zeitung* on May 22, 1957:

"Dr. Balluseck...[recorded measurements] of his crimes committed against children between 9 and 14 years old ... in four thick diaries ... of a pseudo-scientific character ... while in correspondence with the American sexual researcher Kinsey ... about his research, which as he said himself, took place over three decades."⁵

Another German newspaper, the *Berliner Zeitung*, reported on May 16, 1957:

"Kinsey had asked the paedophile specifically for material of his perverse actions. The presiding judge, Dr. [Heinrich] Berger, noted that it was Kinsey's duty to get Balluseck locked up, instead of corresponding with him."⁶

In an attempt to soften the impact of the crimes, the current director of the Kinsey Institute, Dr. John Bancroft, told the *Indianapolis Star* on September 19, 1995, that the information in Tables 30-34 came from one pedophile, a man called Mr. X, later revealed to be Rex King. Regardless of the number of pedophiles involved, it is clear that they had a skewed perception of child sexuality, that Kinsey encouraged the abuse, and that they left sexually abused children in their wake.

SEX EDUCATION

Kinsey used this data to argue that all children are sexual beings from birth. The modern sex education movement is built on his premise. As a result, advocates say it logically follows that children should be taught

about sexual acts from the earliest ages. Today, the Sexuality Information and Education Council of the United States (SIECUS), a group founded by Kinsey followers, recommends beginning sex education as early as kindergarten. Dr. Mary Calderone, SIECUS' founding president, has written extensively on the value of "child sexuality."⁷ Children should be taught that masturbation is a good thing, and that no sexual act is wrong. "The words deviant and deviation ought to be used scientifically with no moral or values connotation," she writes.⁸ Meanwhile, research indicates that from age six to puberty, children's sexual curiosity is at a minimum – unless they are exposed to sexually graphic materials.

Kinsey's philosophy is seen everywhere in modern America. It explains the popularity of values-neutral sex education in the school system and the inclusion of homosexuality in the curriculum. And it also undergirds former Surgeon General Joycelyn Elders' controversial contention: "We taught them what to do in the front seat, now it's time to teach them what to do in the back seat." Elders also promotes teaching young children how to masturbate and she wrote the forward for a book that advocates lowering the sexual age of consent to 12.⁹

Most Americans understand that early exposure to sexuality has a negative impact on children. Dr. Melvin Anchell notes that adult perverts are typically the product of premature sexual experiences or seductions – often occurring in early childhood. He gives a special warning about the dangers of SIECUS-type sex education:

"The sex material used in schools is essentially the same found in commercial pornography," he writes. "However, the pornography presented in schools is more damaging to the child. Students suspect that debased sexuality in movies, magazines, and books is make-believe, but similar presentations given by teachers are regarded as truth."¹⁰

Each year the federal government pours hundreds of millions of dollars of taxpayer money into various sex education programs that are rooted in Kinsey's data. **CWA urges U.S. representatives and senators to investigate Kinsey and find out exactly how he obtained the child sexuality information contained in Tables 31 through 34.** It's time to put an end to more than 50 years of deception.
