
2007 Legislature expanded Iowa Core to K - 8th grades with additional subjects of Social Studies and 21st Century Learning Skills.

2013 Because of the opposition to the the invasive assessment part of Iowa core, Smarter Balanced Assessment, legislators asked the Department of Education to form a task force to find the best assessment for Iowa students.

2014 *July.* Gov. Branstad withdrew Iowa from Smarter Balanced Assessment as a member state.


