WHO IS YWA?

YWA is a student-oriented initiative that is geared toward high school and college campuses to bring active groups of like-minded women together to promote conservative values on their campuses and in the nation.



YWA CAMPUS CHAPTERS

YWA chapters are groups of women (and like-minded men) who meet regularly to learn about public policy issues, pray, and act. Your group can meet monthly, semi-monthly, or even weekly. Each meeting consists of a short devotional, discussion of a current policy topic, an action item, and time spent in prayer. CWA publishes a monthly newsletter you can use as a format for your meetings, as well as policy papers, brochures, and other resources to help you educate your campus about conservative values. CWA will also send you action alerts to let you know when and how you can make your voice heard. We'll even help you host special events on your campus — from forums and seminars to charity fundraisers and military appreciation banquets. CWA provides you with all of the information you'll need for your chapter meetings and events.

Our country needs young women like you to be a voice for Christian values on your campus! By starting a YWA chapter, you can truly make a difference.



The purpose of a YWA chapter is to educate, pray, and act. Here are a few things your chapter can do:

Educate

- ∞ Hold meetings to keep members informed on current public policy issues.
- ∞ Host forums and speaker events that will challenge and educate your campus about conservative issues.

Pray

- ∞ Hold weekly prayer meetings to pray for our elected officials and our nation.
- ∞ Organize prayer vigils outside abortion clinics or government buildings.

Act

- ∞ Fundraise to raise awareness and support for worthwhile causes.
- ∞ Volunteer for community organizations like crisis pregnancy centers.
- ∞ Hold voter registration drives.
- ∞ Write op-eds for your campus or local newspapers.
- ∞ Attend conferences and rallies.

7 EASY STEPS TO STARTING A CHAPTER

- ❑ Fill out the response form below. We will contact you and send a leader application.
- ❑ Complete the application and provide two references.
- ❑ Receive your YWA Leader manual and schedule a YWA Leader training session with us over the phone.
- ❑ Make a list of like-minded friends and other students who you could invite to your club.
- ❑ Find a faculty sponsor and register your chapter as an official campus club.
- ❑ Pick a time and location for your meetings and put up flyers around campus to spread the word about your new chapter.
- ❑ Hold your first meeting — and don't forget to invite your friends!
