What Will Be the Legacy of Our Generation?

It's almost impossible to begin our newsletter this spring without talking about the life and legacy of Billy Graham. His death earlier this year at age 99 was reported around the world, and millions watched his funeral service as North Carolina live-streamed world-wide. A friend to Presidents, world leaders, as well as ordinary people, he was respected by young and old, rich and poor, white, Black, Asian, etc. Many will seek to read his books and messages long after his death.

In 2005, when asked how he wanted to be remembered, Rev. Graham responded, “I want to be remembered as a person who was faithful to God, faithful to the Scriptures, and faithful to my calling ... a man who dedicated his life to the Lord and never looked back.” He indeed left the legacy for which he had hoped.

We know a truly great legacy when we see it continued

through the next generation(s). Look at the generations that are following Billy Graham. Even though temporarily some fell away from God, all of his children and grandchildren are now faithfully serving the Lord because Rev. Graham unapologetically proclaimed the full counsel of God and never gave a watered down Gospel to tickle their ears.

Let us look to the Scriptures for an example of legacy.

Timothy's mother and grandmother loved the Lord and “brought Timothy up in the training and admonition of the Lord,” (Ephesians 6:4). You can be sure they, too, did not give a watered down Gospel. In 2 Timothy 4:3-4 he says, “For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own

desires, and will turn away their ears from the truth and wander into myths.”

Restore/Preserve Campus Free Speech; and Strengthen Human Trafficking Laws.

As a child, the tension in our house was thick and noisy around election time. My father was a staunch Democrat, and my mother was just as staunch a Republican. Together, more often than not, they canceled each other's vote at the polls. But not voting was never an option. We children knew not to risk bad behavior until after an election for fear we would pay a price equal to our parents' political agitation.

privilege. My mom took me to a home, where I proved my identity with a copy of my birth certificate and my driver's license. I felt this rite of passage was a significant adult responsibility. I still do.

You and I have heard all the excuses for not voting. "My vote won't make a difference." "My vote won't change a thing." "Politics is so bad. I don't want anything to do with it." "I never know who to vote for." "Politicians are all alike." "Two things my mother told me never to discuss, politics and religion." "It's too much trouble." "The ballot is too complicated."

We've also heard the rebuttals to these excuses. It took one vote to make English the language of

America. It took one vote to bring Texas into the Union. It took one vote to give the leadership of the Nazi Party to Adolph Hitler. John F. Kennedy won the presidency by less than one vote per precinct. In the 2000 presidential election, it took only 537 votes in Florida to deny Al Gore the presidency.

In this post-modern 21st century, our culture is in an amoral morass. Corruption in the government is becoming rampant. Still, many Christians do not even know who their local, state, and national elected officials are. Many do not even know where or how to register to vote. They do not know where to go to vote. Often they are not even aware there is an election in progress. And many do not know how to find the

answers to these questions. Do you know for sure that you are registered to vote? If you are not registered, you can start the process by going to the links on the side bar. It is that easy. Encourage the members of your Prayer/ Action Chapter or Home Team and your family and friends to be sure they are registered.

What about you? Did you vote in the last election? Were you informed about the candidates? Did you encourage your peers to vote? Doesn't matter, today is a new day! The question now is, "What *will* you do in

the May Primary or the November General Election?"

It is our responsibility as Christians to vote. Only about 50% of Christians are even registered to vote. And I am told only about 50% of Christians who are registered actually vote. The Bible gives us the correct admonition in Exodus 18:21, "But select capable men from all the people, men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain."

It is our privilege and responsibility as Americans

to vote. If our children and grandchildren do not inherit a free America, you and I will bear the fault. John F. Kennedy said, "The ignorance of one voter in a democracy impairs the security of all."

In Support of Resistance and Rescue

As one who has been in the ministry of opposing human

trafficking for almost two years, much of my time has been spent educating the community about the realities of sexual exploitation. Last month, I spoke at a local private university about this subject. Many of the attendees were surprised to learn about the connection between pornography and sex trafficking. They didn't know that force, fraud, and coercion are used to lure victims into the trafficking industry. One young woman stated that before the talk she regarded pornography as an artistic expression that empowered women. This college student, self-identifies as very liberal and a "feminist", and had always thought of pornography as a venue that allowed a woman to do

whatever she wanted with her own body.

It is not uncommon for those in this age group to share this particular student's point of view. Music, television shows, and movies that are geared to the younger generation normalize aggressive sexual behavior. Females grow to expect to be treated like an object, and boys associate sexual behavior with violence and aggression. Pornography and sexually explicit material become teachers for what is to be acceptable interactions. A survey done by *The Atlantic* found that about 30% of adults find the viewing of pornography morally acceptable. This is a very disheartening statistic, especially for those who understand the link between pornography and sex trafficking.

The article, "*Prostitution and Trafficking in Nevada: Making the Connections*," published in multiple publications, stated "in a very literal way that pornography is advertising for trafficking, not just in general but also in the sense that traffickers and pimps use pornographic images of victims as specific advertising for their 'products.'" Interviews with former female "workers" of the pornography industry discuss situations where women are beaten, threatened, and coerced into performing specific sex acts. Women are forced to perform in scenes that depict an act of consensual sex. Yet, this is not the reality. According to Patrick Trueman, CEO of Morality in Media, "*Pornography is a powerful factor in creating the demand for illicit sex.*"

The act of purchasing pornography directly contributes to the demand of victims of trafficking.

How can we solve the issues of sexual exploitation if we cannot decrease demand? Answer: Take action and pray.

Take Action:

1. As parents we need to take a stand in our homes. Viewing pornography should not be regarded as a “boys being boys” type of behavior.
2. We need to boldly identify pornography for what it is with our peers.
3. We need to encourage our churches/pastors to be

open about the topic and teach the importance of honoring God in this area.

4. It is important for us to reach out to the North Carolina General Assembly members in support of Human Trafficking Resistance and Rescue Act, HB 910: Resistance and Rescue. If passed, this bill would increase anti-trafficking efforts in our state. Encourage them not only to support it but to

persuade others to do the same. Though HB 910 didn't make it through the legislative process last year, we are hopeful it will this session. Contacting your legislators will help that happen. Be sure to let them know that you are a member of Concerned Women for America. On August 9, 2017, April arrived at Family Reproductive Health Clinic in Charlotte. Do not let the name of this clinic fool you. It claims to be for the family, but destroys them. If you haven't guessed it by now, yes, this clinic performs abortions.

With four children already and now pregnant again, April and her husband, Anthony, found themselves concerned on how to provide for one more — until they met Katherine, a sidewalk counselor, at the abortion clinic. Sidewalk counselors serve on the frontlines at these clinics. Katherine was able to tell April about all the resources that our network has to offer. Thankfully, April and Anthony chose LIFE that day!

The love that a sidewalk counselor has for abortion-minded women and post-abortive women does not

end when they leave an abortion clinic. They strive to support these women as much as possible and provide tangible resources for them. Most importantly, they share the love of Christ and the message that He always provides for those who trust Him.

Katherine and I traveled from North Carolina to South Carolina to drop off TONS of baby items donated by Truth & Mercy Pro-life Ministries. This is when I first met April and her beautiful children. There was an instant connection. April beamed with so much joy as she showed us the ultrasound of her baby girl she had named Lyrik. We left her home that day anxiously awaiting the day when Lyrik would be born.

About a week before April was scheduled to be induced, we received news that baby Lyrik was

delivered stillborn. Heartbroken and shaken to the core, we found comfort in Psalm 34:18 which says, “The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.”

Back to South Carolina we went. As we visited with April, we all found consolation and rest in this wonderful promise that God had welcomed Lyrik into His presence, her eternal home. We were comforted with the joy and hope in knowing we will see her in Heaven.

April followed the Lord's will and chose LIFE that day outside the abortion clinic. I have no explanation for why Lyrik's life was so short; but I do know this: today April has comfort knowing that she did not take her child's life. Lyrik touched many hearts and impacted many lives before she was even born.

April and Anthony have become family to Katherine and me. It has been wonderful watching them as they glorify Christ through all their heartache.

Elections, U.S. Supreme Court, and America's Relationship with Israel

Elections

This year all 435 United States House seats are up for election. North Carolina has thirteen of those Congressional seats with 10 Republicans and three Democrats. North Carolina has no U.S. Senate elections this year.

The 2018 mid-term elections will determine which course our government will take as both parties vie for the majority in both the U.S. House and Senate. The outcome will impact the crucial confirmations of federal judges and possible Supreme Court justices. Please pray daily for God to send moral, virtuous, and Christian men and women to both Congress and local and state offices. Pray they will be ones who protect our Constitution and accomplishments made during this administration concerning First Amendment rights, the life of the unborn and more.

U.S. Supreme Court

In Isaiah 1:26, the Lord called for judges in Jerusalem to once again rule righteously. "I will restore your judges as at the first, and your counselors as at the beginning; after that you will be called the city of righteousness, a faithful city." God also instructs judges in

2 Chronicles 19:6-7, "Consider what you are doing, for you do not judge for man, but for the Lord who is with you when you render judgment."

Two Supreme Court cases are expected to hand down decisions by the end of June:

A pro-life case - *National Institute of Family and Life Advocates v. Becerra*. Please pray the Justices will protect the First Amendment rights of pro-life clinics in California and ultimately the country. These pro-life crisis pregnancy centers were forced to have printed notices in several languages directing women to facilities that provide abortion, a great affront to their mission to defend the unborn and their mothers, and ultimately their religious freedom.

An election map case - *Benisek v. Lamone*, concerning how much control state officials in Maryland should have over their right to redraw voting districts, or partisan gerrymandering. This will greatly affect North Carolina because we currently have this issue here. Whereas Democrats tend to have high numbers in clusters around our state, such as big cities, Republican

numbers tend to be dispersed widely. Historically, whichever party is in power in the state has used gerrymandering to hold on to power. North Carolina Democrats are no different. They are using the tool of the court to fight the Republicans by redrawing geographical congressional districts, an on-going battle using race as the reason and often used to disrupt elections.

America's Relationship with Israel

Lastly, America's relationship with Israel is a very important issue that CWA lists as one of our [seven-core issues](#). Recently, Vice-President Mike Pence addressed the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) where he stated, "We stand with Israel because her cause is our cause, her values are our values, and her fight is our fight. We stand with Israel because we believe in right over wrong, in good over evil, in liberty over tyranny. The United States was proud to be the first nation in the world to recognize the State of Israel in 1948. In May of this year, we will open the American Embassy in Jerusalem." We are thankful that President Trump kept his campaign promise to open our embassy in Jerusalem.

Being Parent Centric in a Child Centric World

As a practicing pediatrician for over 25 years, I am reminded everyday how differently our children behave now. When in medical school and in training, few children were diagnosed with ADHD or psychiatric disorders. Virtually none were admitted to psychiatric institutions, and high school massacres were unheard of.

What has happened to our kids? How did we get here and how does this affect the future of our children and grandchildren?

Sixty years ago parents understood their roles in the lives of their children as that of steward and guide. Today parents have become their

child's companion and friend. Instead of being a source of authority, they are now equal in stature. A companion is not a source of authority. Kids now believe their parents do not know any better than themselves how to navigate through life.

Recently one little boy and his mother were involved in a car accident. Neither was seriously hurt but were taken to the hospital for observation. Mom fell apart in the ER crying uncontrollably while her son watched and became quite shaken. Both were released. But David became anxious, never wanting to be alone, having panic attacks whenever in the car, unable to sleep at night; and his

grades were slipping so they came in for an appointment.

David's security had been shaken; his mom and guiding light on earth, could not be counted on. I tried to explain to Mom that David needed a loving authority but she did not grasp it. Her son continued to flounder and perform poorly at school and became more depressed and anxious.

My solution was to work on Mom first. Her confidence in her Rock had to be restored before her son's outlook could be mended. As her relationship with her son was that of friend, when something bad happened and he saw his mom's severe reaction, David lost his ability to cope. His child-

centric rearing did not allow him to have the ability to get back up from a difficult situation and go forward. After several visits to our Clinic, the ship began to turn around and Mom became the source of strength that David needed. He began to sleep, eat, do better in school and smile again. This was the effect of parent-centric parenting. I

like to call this The Power of the Mom!

All kids have a similar experience when life hits them hard. As parents, we must understand that we are raising the people of tomorrow giving them resilience to get through life's difficulties. They are always watching us. Are we acting as the loving

authority? We want to have them as our friends someday but let's leave that as our goal as they become adults, perhaps with children of their own.

Until then, our kids need Moms and Dads. In this way, we Save America One Child at a Time.

Ending Pornography Exposure to Children

Having assisted search engines to create family-safe search practices, I

founded The Third Talk Foundation, the solution to young kids' exposure to pornography. With a degree in child psychology and a Subject Matter Expert (SME), The Third Talk Foundation offers a real-world solution that continues to show great results long after the initial prevention discussion.

Twelve billion pornographic videos were viewed by children under 18 in America in 2016; that's 380 per second. With 74 million children under 18 in America today, that's an average of 162 porn videos viewed by every child under 18 in America every year; obviously 16-year olds watch more porn than 6-year olds. Online pornography is a topic that all parents must address head on and immediately. I am a fierce advocate for children avoiding pornography and have been for 16 years. For eight of those years, my work included helping to manage the relationship between

Yahoo!, Google, and BING, and the results they delivered from pornography-based queries.

This work allowed me to witness firsthand why government, law enforcement, and many non-government organizations have failed to slow the exposure of porn to our kids. The Department of Justice can act only if a crime has been committed. The Department of Education receives significant push back from parents regarding any mention of pornography in schools while the Department of Health and Human Services is conducting research to determine if porn exposure is bad for kids. Reminder: it took us 40 years to shrink "Joe Camel" off a pack of cigarettes and make the declarative statement nationally that "smoking cigarettes is bad for kids."

The only solution is speaking with parents and children, together in the same room, and offering a real-world solution to our rising porn epidemic. My ministry does not offend, blame, shame, ridicule, or

use colorful language. I speak to families and congregations regarding the world our kids live in, not the world we wished they lived in.

For two decades the "hands-off" approach to porn has failed. The only remedy is communication between kids and their parents. This communication, "The Third Talk™", about porn is without homework, memorization, workbooks, data to send, CD's, software or additional sessions.

John initiates this challenging topic for parents from a place of respect, knowledge, care, and our Holy Father's eternal love, giving a 60-minute description of this challenge and how we mitigate its hurt to our kids, along with concepts for families to discuss together after The Third Talk.

It is time to end this silent epidemic for our young people.

"Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he shall not depart from it." -Proverbs 22:6



"Parents have 'The Talk' to teach their kids about the birds and the bees. A second talk regarding sexual development usually happens around middle school and is most often given by a guidance counselor or health teacher. Young children are then left on their own to go discover their own sexuality. Sadly, most children do that online. When you then combine the ubiquitous nature of online porn, cell phones in the hands of every tween and teen, busy and/or uninformed parents, and a lack of discussion in our schools and churches, our kids operate in an environment that allows pornography to be available to them in a way it has never been available before in human history. Because of this confluence of external conditions, Parents now need to have another talk with their kids. The Third Talk™ parents need to have with their kids, is about online porn."

The Stats Show We Made A Difference

In the 2015 municipal elections, less than 15% of Charlotte's registered voters elected liberal Mayor Jennifer Roberts who sought to introduce a radical bathroom ordinance resulting in hyper-negative attention to North Carolina. In the 2016 elections, numerous conservative groups working behind the scenes hoped to produce larger election day turnouts than in 2015. However, even though "there was a national wave that put several progressive anti-Christian politicians into office all across the nation," the hard work of conservative groups did make an impact in Charlotte.

Tami Fitzgerald, Executive Director for NC Values Coalition, in which CWA of North Carolina is a partner, summarized the 2016 elections stating,

- With our work organizing online and on the ground in Charlotte, we helped increase the conservative side of the vote nearly **+32%**.
- In 2015, about **38,000** of our voters went to the polls.

- In 2017, nearly **50,000** of our voters voted.
- This is nearly **+8,000** more than what Jennifer Roberts got in 2015.
- In 2015, overall turnout was **14.76%**, while this year it was **21%**.

We are encouraged and realize that we must continue to pull together and educate our friends and families to understand the crucial impact we will make at the polls. We must remain resolved to study the candidates and vote. We have important 2018 mid-term elections. In North Carolina, some of us will have the opportunity to vote in the primary with Early Voting beginning on April 19 and the primary election day, May 8.

In this upcoming election, we urge all to vote your values!
