

## Term limits come with unexpected consequences:

- ◆ The Articles of Confederation, our first Constitution, had term limits, but experience led the Founders to omit them in our current Constitution.
- South Dakota state legislature has lost "institutional wisdom" because of term limits.
- Term limits deny the voter the liberty to reelect his or her choice. We are throwing the baby out with the bathwater.
- If Members of Congress were termed out, their staff would simply move on to another congressman. Influential staff is not termed. Neither are lobbyists nor unelected bureaucrats.
- Congress has only an 18% approval rate, but a 96% re-election rate. Why do we continue to re -elect them? A well-informed electorate is necessary to demand adherence to the Constitution and accountability! (tinyurl.com/3ahbcpwv and tinyurl.com/mw29rhvf)
- In a lawmaker's final term, no longer believing he is accountable to his constituents, he might promote objectionable policy and accept favors from lobbyists.
- ◆ The best term limits are elections.
